1. Can one book count in more than one category?

- a. Yes. Example:
 - i. *Ducks* by Kate Beaton qualifies as a graphic novel and a Canada Reads novel

2. Do the items have to come from the library?

a. Yes. All items must come from the Library or from the Libby app

3. What does it mean when it says "Trilogy"?

a. Read all three books in the series

4. What does it mean when it says "Sequel"?

- a. You only need to read the sequel; reading the first book is optional. Example:
 - *i. Revenge Wears Prada*, Sequel to *The Devil Wears Prada*, by Lauren Weisberger

5. Do I have to keep track of what I read?

a. Yes. You can write the titles on either side of the Bingo card

6. What is a "door stopper book"?

a. Any book larger than the average size hard cover fiction book. These can be found in our adult oversize collection located at the end of aisle 8 or in the juvenile picture books

7. What is meant by "has a colour in the title"?

- a. The book title must have a colour in it. Examples include:
 - i. Anne of Green Gables
 - ii. The Golden Compass

8. What is a book that can be finished in one sitting?

a. A book with 150 pages or less, depending on how fast you read. Many graphic novels may also be considered in this category and can thus be counted in two places.

9. Who is considered to be a local author?

- a. A local author is anyone who lives in the East Kootenays. Local authors include:
